

Performance Guidelines Rules of Conduct

- ♫ Musicians are to behave on and off stage at all times.
- ♫ No standing on leads or cables.
- ♫ Strictly no touching buttons on keyboards, playing their instrument at inappropriate times and displaying inappropriate standing or sitting posture.
- ♫ Musicians need to be competent with all musical repertoire at the time of each performance or will not be able to perform.
- ♫ The final line up for each performance is determined by the Orchestra Director.
- ♫ The Orchestra Director has the authority to remove musicians during any performance who do not conform to the performance guidelines (Three warning policy and the musician will be sent off stage).
- ♫ The Orchestra Director has the final say over all matters relating to performance outcomes.

Parental Responsibility

- ♫ Their child conforms to the performance guidelines and rules of conduct.
- ♫ Their child wears the AKA badge, has the correct music and uniform at each performance.
- ♫ Their child arrives 30-45 minutes prior to each performance.
- ♫ Transporting their child to and from each performance.
- ♫ Their child attends all scheduled rehearsals (3 days notice is required for musicians who are unable to attend a rehearsal).

Costs

There are no ongoing costs for musicians to participate in the Mozartini Orchestra besides owning their own instrument.

Informed Consent

Informed consent is automatically given to the Orchestra Director by parents, for photos and video footages of their child during any Mozartini performance to be used for marketing and promotional purposes both in electronic media and written format. 24 hours notice is required prior to each scheduled performance by parents if they do not wish their child to be photographed throughout a performance.

Welcome

The Mozartini Orchestra is named after the world's most famous child prodigy Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart and translates to "Little Mozart's". The aim of the Mozartini Orchestra is to provide music students between the ages of 3 to 8 years of age with performance opportunities and an ensemble learning environment.

Orchestra Director

The Mozartini Orchestra was created by Orchestra Director Lorenzo Capitanio. Lorenzo believes playing music in an orchestra is similar to playing sport. There are different players, each with a specific role to play. Success in the orchestra depends solely on the musicians ability to conform to performance guidelines and rules of conduct, identical to rules associated within a sporting team.

Musicians

The Mozartini Orchestra consists of piano, violin and guitar. **Dress code** for girls is a dress and for boys black trousers and shoes, with a Mozartini uniformed shirt provided for boys to wear. Musicians are required to have the following equipment.



*Piano Musicians

- Portable Keyboard
- Keyboard Stand
- Keyboard Adaptor
- Black Stool (optional)



Violin Musicians

- Violin
- Black Music Stand
- Black Stool
- Spare Strings



Guitar Musicians

- Guitar & Amplifier
- Black Music Stand
- Black Stool (Optional)
- Spare Strings

*The Orchestra Director will provide a limited number of keyboards at each performance. On occasion piano musicians will be required to bring their own keyboard at each performance.

Performance Venue

Performances are primarily held at Metropolitan Shopping Centres and public places of interest. Most performances are scheduled during school holidays, weekends and the Christmas period. The duration of each performance is between 20-30 minutes and up to four individual performances maybe scheduled on the same day at one venue. It is **not** compulsory for musicians to attend all performances nor all the performances on the same day at the one venue.

Rehearsals

Rehearsals are held on Saturdays or Sundays at the Australian Keyboard Academy. An average of 2 to 4 rehearsals may be required prior to a scheduled performance.

Music

All Mozartini Orchestra music will be provide by the Orchestra Director and will remain the property of the Mozartini Orchestra.
